



Brian Shepherd's Scottish Shortbread Recipe

Brian Shepherd is known for his expertise in growing and propagating beautiful cactus from the Southwest and Mexico, as well as mesembs and other succulents. There's one more thing Brian is known for....Scottish Shortbread! It is simply delicious, and requests for this flakey, buttery delight have undoubtedly increased. I have to admit, it is one of the things I looked forward to at the Summer Show/Sale! Brian has generously answered the many requests for his recipe (below). I for one, will give it a try! Scottish shortbread recipie

Many folks have asked for this. It is the same one I used for the summer show.

<u>Ingredients:</u>	<u>Amount</u>	
All purpose flour	4 ¾ cups	
Sugar	1 1/8 cups	
Rice flour (Red Mill brown or white)	2/3 cups	
Butter (salted Land o Lakes is ok)	1 lb	
Salt (not sea salt)	½ tsp.	
D. Harriston and A.A. H. A.A. L. Harriston Co. Called S.	0 1	

Butter flavor (Molly Mcbutter Sprinkles) 3 tsp. (optional)

The dry ingredients can be kept in a zip lock bag for at least 2 wks at room temperature, or indef. in the freezer. I usually make two batches at a time.

Mix dry ingredients in a large bowl. Melt butter in microwave 1-2 min. Should be used very warm. Add the melted butter to the dry mix and stir with a fork until all butter is absorbed. Make a stiff dough by kneading about 1min. Crumble and press the warm mix into a 11 x 17in. metal non stick baking tray. Press until level with palm of hand. (I have not had much success with a roller!) Should be half in. or less thick. Mark pieces with a knife into squares. Make holes in each piece with a small fork. Bake in convection oven for 1-1 hr and 15 min approx. at 320 F. Most convection ovens automatically reduce the temp. to 295 F. As your oven may be slightly different, you may want to use a lower temp. to start with. When done it should be evenly light brown all the way through. Lift a piece out to check. Putting the tray back for further baking is ok. Take out and leave about 5min. to cool slightly. Remark with knife and sprinkle with bakers sugar (finer than regular.) Break into pieces after about 1hr. If you have a regular oven reduce the temp.to about 290F and place another tray on next lower tier. This should prevent cooking too fast and burning the bottom of the shortbread. If your convection oven does not reduce the temp. automatically, use 295 F. Lower temps are usually safer, you can always cook longer. Most common mistake is cooking too much. Butter burns easily.
