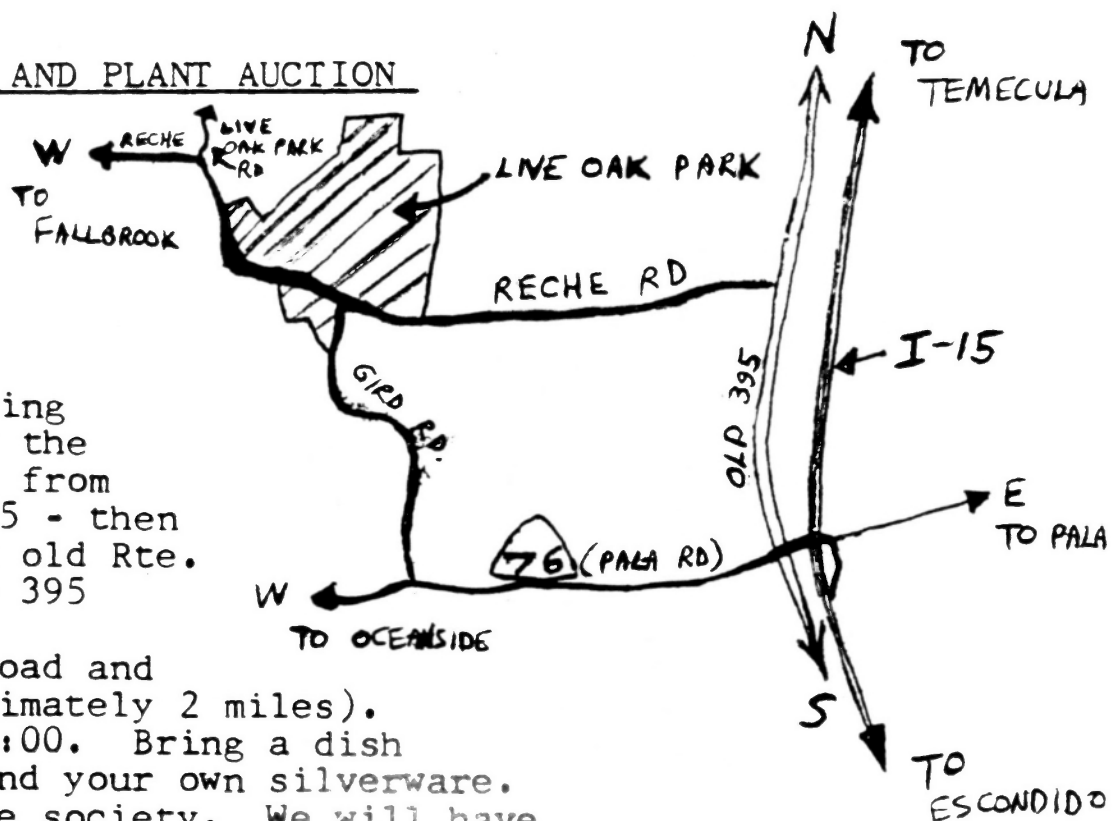
Speaker: Gordon Rowley, Horticulturalist, Botanist, and Author

NEW BOOK REVIEW

Haworthia and Astroloba A Collector's Guide

by John Pilbeam

A companion volume to John Pilbeam's very successful study of the genus *Mammillaria* has just been published by B.T. Batsford Ltd., 1983. With 176 pages, 225 black-and-white photographs, 94 line illustrations by the author, and 8 pages of color illustrations showing almost 60 different plants, it will prove to be a regularly consulted work.

The literature on *Haworthia*, with some 70 species, but with considerable variation within them, has hitherto been scattered, often in obscure publications in various languages. Bayer's Haworthia Handbook, published in 1976, and his later revision The New Haworthia Handbook examined and completely revised the taxonomy of *Haworthia*, including an understanding of the variability of species which had led to the oversplitting of species in the past. Bayer's work is very much a botanist's work, leaving many of the needs of the collector unprovided for. This new book includes a detailed commentary on the species written from the grower's point of view, details of cultural requirements, geographical distribution, classification (worked out by the author in collaboration with M.B. Bayer), a glossary of terms, and an extended bibliography. *Astroloba*, a closely related genus, is included for completeness, since its separate standing has sometimes been disputed.

Haworthias are exclusive to South Africa with two minor exceptions. Like the Aloes, rainfall distribution is quite interesting in relation to *Haworthia* species' distribution, and their cultural requirements, ranging from some that are strictly winter growers, to others that appear to tolerate if not require summer watering. The book includes an introduction with a list of new names, an excellent, but brief chapter on cultivation, a classification chapter including a revision of sections, a well illustrated chapter on flowers, fruit, and seed, showing the basis for the three subgenera, a distribution chapter with maps, and a checklist of species with lower taxa expanded upon in the "commentary on species". It is here that the bulk of the cultural information, as well as each species' classification history, and distribution are to be found. Two surprises in store are found under the newly classified *H. bruynsii* listing, and the "*Haworthia* balls" treatment found under *H. marumiana*. This book will most certainly be treasured as a standard reference work among growers and collectors.
