"Exploring South Africa from Cape Town to Richtersveld"

Guillermo will take us on a journey through the provinces of the Western and Northern Capes, exploring the great succulent diversity of South Africa. We will explore several National and State Parks: Namaqua, Richtersveld, and others. Conophytums, Lithops, Aloes, Pachypodium, and many Mesembs are among the plants we are going to highlight in this presentation. There will also be some wildlife shots from Kruger National Park and photos of the incredible event of mass flowering in the desert.

Guillermo Rivera was born in Argentina and is owner of Southern Cross Nature

Tours (formerly, South America Nature Tours). cated to the organization of botanical and nature tours throughout mainly South America (Chile, Argentina, Brazil, Peru, Columbia, Boliva, Ecuador), Mexico, and also South Africa, Madagascar, and Namibia, with emphasis on succulent plants, bromeliads, and orchids.

Guillermo is a former researcher at the University of Cordoba, Argentina. He holds a BS degree in Biology, University of Cordoba; MS Marine Biology, Northeastern University; PhD in Botany, University of Cordoba.

(Trust these directions, not Google Maps, Mapquest, or phone GPS)

15 Freeway. Exit El Norte Pkway which is 1 mile north of Hwy 78 Right turn from northbound, head east or Left turn from southbound, head east Immediate right on Seven Oaks Rd (frontage rd). Left on Borden Rd (1/4 mile). Left on Avocado Ave (1/2 mile)

> Here's the tricky part... 1/4 mile on Avocado Ave, there is an unmarked cul-de-sac. The house on the corner has a white block wall about 2 feet high. THIS IS PART OF AVOCADO AVE, not a different street. Turn left up this cul-de-sac. At the end of the cul-de-sac, there are two parallel driveways on the right. Ours is the one on the right side.

We will have a sign at the bottom of the driveway indicating 1172 Park in the cul-de-sac. If you pull nose-in at the front of the dirt hill, we can fit more cars.

Anza-Borrego Desert State Park

This park is the largest state park in California. When the Park was formed in the early 1930s, it was checker boarded by thousands of acres of private land inholdings — one estimate is as high as 60,000 acres, which is 10% of the current Park. In the last 49 years, the Anza-Borrego Foundation (ABF) has acquired more than 52,000 acres of those inholdings and other properties to give to the Park. In 2001, the purchase of 2,675-acre Lucky 5 Ranch created a wildlife corridor between Anza-Borrego Desert State Park and Cuyamaca Rancho State Park, a mountain habitat. SDCSS contributed to that effort. Since then, additional portions have been acquired that provide a connection between the parks and Cleveland National Forest to the south. However, there are still a few inholdings left to complete the Park.

The Park also endeavors to conserve and protect the extensive plant life found throughout the 600,000 acres. With 92 different plant families, 346 genera and hundreds of flowering species, there is quite the variety of flora to discover. As ABF always seeks new funds to support the land acquisition habitat con-


