

Borrego Bloom

Plant of the Month Presentation By Leslie Sheridan



Each year I get excited when spring rolls around as it presents another opportunity to visit the wildflowers in Anza Borrego. I love the contrast of the dry desert floor and the bright colorful flowers. This year I was particularly eager due to our high rainfall and the anticipation of a "superbloom". My friend and I made the drive out to the Anza Borrego State Park and were not disappointed. It was a beautiful sunny day but still chilly when the wind passed through. The visitor center was quite busy as other nature lovers made

the trip to check out the wildlife. Close to the parking lot was a lot of Indigo flower, *Psorothamnus schottii*, Beaver tail cactus, *Opuntia bailaris*, and Ocotillo, *Fouquieria splendens*. The further away we got from the visitor center there was a lot more variety to be found, but the flowers were very small and low to the ground. Open closer examination some of the blooms were quite spectacular. There was a lot of Parish's poppy, *Eschscholzia parishii*, with bright yellow blooms, Desert star, *Monoptilon bellioides*, with cheery white flowers and Brown eyed Primrose which I found to be very colorful. One of the more exciting finds was a large *Ferocactus cylindaraceus*, or Barrel cactus, that was waist high and most like a couple of hundred years old. There were many other varieties of small wildflowers and I will be presenting pictures of these during my presentation. ~ Leslie Sheridan



Gasterias: South Africa's Big Smile

Why have I called my program on *Gasteria*, 'South Africa's Big Smile"? It's not because they look amusing, with their plump flowers and tongue-like leaves, but because the distribution of the genus is shaped like a big smile, starting near the Namibia-South Africa border in the northwest, extending

down along the west coast and all the way across the southern part of the country, and then up the east coast to the Transvaal in the country's northeast. There are 24 recognized species, along with a number of subspecies and varieties, and all of them occur in South Africa, with a little spillover into neighboring

countries at either end of the "smile". The talk will include lots of habitat photos as well as pictures of plants in cultivation. ~ Brian

SFSCS Vice-President Brian Kemble has given numerous presentations for the club in past years, but this is the first time he has done a program on Gasteria. He has been growing these wonderful plants since the 70's, and has sought them



out in his travels in South Africa. Though related to Aloe and Haworthia, the genus Gasteria has a charm all its own, with its dangling, pot-bellied flowers and the great range of textures and markings found in its leaves.



The Old World Garden Accession project is moving right along. Over 200 plants have been tagged and catalogued. We expect to put at least 50 tags in each month, the new plants that have re-

cently gone in and portions of those planted long ago.
