


Thank you to Sherman Blench and Brita Miller for storing and bringing boxes for the sales plants.



**“FROM MEGA TO ANKOBER:
LOOKING FOR SUCCULENTS
IN ETHIOPIA”**

ABOUT OUR SPEAKER

Brian Kemble is the Curator at the Ruth Bancroft Garden in Walnut Creek, California, where he has worked for many years. He is also the VP of the San Francisco Succulent and Cactus Society, and a past board member of the Cactus & Succulent Society of America. He has written over 700 published articles on succulents and other drought-tolerant plants, and he has contributed photos to numerous books on succulents, including *The Timber Press Guide to Succulent Plants of the World*. His travels in search of succulents have taken him to many countries, including Mexico, South Africa, Namibia, Lesotho, Madagascar, Socotra and of course Ethiopia.

ABOUT OUR SPEAKER TOPIC

In July 2018, Brian Kemble traveled to Ethiopia for two weeks, along with Walker Young (garden manager at the Ruth Bancroft Garden), John Miller (president of the Institute for Aloe Studies), and Tom Cole (author of *Aloes of Uganda*). Although the trip was planned around visiting various Aloe localities, there were of course many other interesting plants encountered along the way, including tree-sized euphorbias, a variety of stapeliads, and alpine kniphofias.

The habitat types seen were incredibly diverse, from desert to savannah to thorn-forest to jungle to alpine tundra (punctuated by stands of giant lobelias). It was certainly a change of pace to be in a country where a traffic jam usually meant having to weave your way through camels, donkeys and goats!

THE SYMMETRY OF SUCCULENTS AND CACTI

Succulents and cacti are a fascinating group of plants to study. We all have noticed a feature in them that initially caught our eyes. For some it might have been the alien-looking features of the lobes of a cactus. For others it may have been spire that rises up out an Agave plant that Dr. Suess may have based his Truffula trees off of. There's always something that piqued all of our interest in these fascinating plants. Mine was the geometric symmetry of succulents and cactus. The circular patterns with varying degrees of shapes and styles are truly fascinating. Spirals seem to be one of nature's favorite shapes to put into cacti and succulents.

There is also the perpendicular symmetry of the common Barrel Cactus to be marveled at, with its endless rows of spikes that form rows of crosses on top of one another.


