Photos from Big Bear: The cacti are *Echinocereus triglochidiatus* and the beavertail opuntia, *Opuntia basilaris*, that we have in Anza Borrego. I was surprised at how cold tolerant they are; Big Bear definitely gets snow. The bigger *Echinocereus triglochidiatus* are from just east of Big Bear in a much drier area - we made a special trip on the last day, only a 15 minutes detour, to where the PCT crosses SR-18 near Baldwin Lake. The smaller one is from the Cougar Crest trail near Bertha Peak on the north side of Big Bear Lake; there is actually a second plant in the upper right corner of that photo. The *Draba corrugata* and the opuntia were also on a stretch of the PCT but southeast of Big Bear off of SR-38 near Coon Creek. I saw a lot more opuntia, at least two species, after that first one.










