Our August meeting was a good one-Michelle Heckathorn gave an interesting talk on Ledebouria, Drimia, and Drimiopsis-not the best known plants, but *fascinating*! Thanks Michelle!



August saw the return of the ever-popular **pre-meeting workshops**. This month's offering was "Succulents 101" by **Jen Greene**. This well-attended event was full of great growing tips, and Jen answered many questions relating to keeping your plants thriving. Thanks Jen!

Our main speaker, **Kevin Alison** from **Tree of Life Nursery** in San Juan Capistrano, gave a talk on "Preventing Poaching and Extinction: Conservation Strategies for Dudleya." In recent years, many of us have been distressed by reports of large numbers of Dudleyas being stolen from the wild to be shipped out of the country for foreign markets. While completing a Master's Degree in Conservation and Restoration Science, Kevin developed a great strategy to protect this wonderful local genus. This strategy entails large scale propagation and distribution of the most endangered species—once they are no longer rare, they will lose their value to poachers. I love this approach, as I am quite fond of Dudleya and would love to have more in my garden.

On the Tuesday following the meeting, I visited Tree of Life Nursery, visited Kevin, and purchased a bunch of Dudleyas which are now calling my landscape home.



After moving some older succulents on our property, there are many landscaped sized succulents available for new homes. Some are potted and rooted, some have been recently divided and will have few roots, and some will be unrooted divisions. Succulents propagated from our large collection will also be available.

Sale plants include: Adromischus (several different ones), *Dudleya pachyphytum* (open pollinated), several miniature to small agaves and *Agave vilmoriniana* 'Stained Glass', *Cotyledon orbiculata* 'Splash' and *C. oophylla* with purple ends, *Jatropha multifida*, *Euphorbia broussonetii*, *Sansevieria parva* (very fragrant flowers) and 'Midnight Star', *Aloe cameronii* (many recent cuttings), large heads of *Agave stricta* (likely species), Dyckia (several large red ones), *Aloe piernaarii*, Mangave 'Kaleidoscope', *Agave attenuata* 'Kara's Stripes', 6' tall *Aloe ferox*, *Aloe spectabilis*, Haworthia hybrids and many others!

Cash preferred but Paypal payments are possible. The garden will be open for viewing. We hope you will drop in, see the garden, chat about plants, and be tempted to purchase!


