SDCSS DECEMBER SPEAKER



oin us Saturday, December 11th for our IN -PERSON meeting and speaker Jeremy Spath, speaking on the topic of Agave Species, Cultivars & Hybrids.

Our speaker: Jeremy Spath has felt inspired to see agaves in their natural habitat since his first trip into the field more than 15 years ago. This review covers his search for the beautiful agave habitats of the Americas. It additionally covers growing them in cultivation, with a particular emphasis on selecting exceptional clones. After leaving several years with the San Diego Botanic Garden, he began working for Rancho Soledad Nursery, in Rancho Santa Fe, Ca. There he worked with hybridizing agaves to create new and beautiful plants for the nursery. Now, Jeremy owns his own nursery, Hidden Agave in Escondido, California where he continues to grow, hybridize, and tissue culture agaves; as well as continually seek his muse & the endless habitats where they reside. Jeremy will also have available his new book! Agaves, Species Cultivars & Hybrids, a sweeping review of the genus, this new work

takes a deep dive into the world of agaves, both cultivated and in their native habitat. Co-authored with Jeff Moore of Solana Succulents, this 350+ page book offers over 1500 images and informative information about these stunningly beautiful and architectural plants. Cultivars and hybrids are included, as well as discussion on the majority of the species, including many newly discovered ones!


GREAT REASONS TO JOIN THE CSSA



he Cactus and Succulent Society of America (CSSA), which began in 1929, has been on a mission to serve the wide interests of the global cactus and succulent community. It provides a wide range of benefits and services to members including a quarterly journal (topics have included horticultural instruction, new plants, research and conservation reports, travelogues, biographical and historical material, book reviews, and photographs of plants in habitat or cultivation), quarterly To The Point e-newsletter (featuring news, views and growing tips from around the world), bi-monthly webinar series featuring cactus and succulent experts from around the world, ability to purchase cacti and succulent seeds at the CSSA Seed Depot, conventions, field trips, support for research projects (providing small facilitation grants up to \$3000 to help fund welldesigned research programs on the botany, horticulture, and conservation of succulent plants), and conservation efforts. CSSA journals and back issues are available for purchase as is the Haseltonia yearbook (which features peer-reviewed articles about all aspects of cacti, succulents and their environs (topics have included current research and conservation reports, new species descriptions and lengthy taxonomic revisions, historical biographical notes, chemical and cytological studies, evolutionary biology and ethnobotanical reports, propagation and pest control methods, pollinator studies). CSSA also offers specialty books for sale including Aloes of the Cactus & amp; Succulent Journal, Beginner's Guide to Haworthia. Agaves and other Succulent Monocots, Beginner's Guide to Adromischus, Aeonium, Dudleya, Euphorbia, Pelargonium and other Succulent Dicots. Memberships are available to affiliate clubs and individuals.

Our club has a CSSA affiliate club membership, receives the quarterly journal, votes in the CSSA elections, and provides CSSA information to our

members. Several of our club members have been CSSA board members. Individual memberships are available on two levels. A full membership includes the **CSSA** journal, To the Point enewsletter, participation in webinars, access to the seed depot, and ability to participate in conventions and field trips. A new supporting membership includes all of the preceding except



the journal. CSSA also accepts donations which are tax-deductible, which help support all of the services that CSSA provides.

I have enjoyed attending CSSA conventions and regularly participate in the CSSA webinars which have been fantastic (recent ones include Yuccas by Brian Kemble, Rock and Tree Dwelling Succulents of Australia by Attila Kapitany, Oaxaca Meanderings... by Kelly Griffin, Succulent Trees by Dan Mahr, Illegal Poaching of Namaqualand Succulents by Karel Du Toit, and one on Conophytums by Steven Hammer). Our newsletter provides information on upcoming CSSA webinars and the link to register. More information about CSSA is available on their website at https://cactusandsucculentsociety.org.




